Dr. Foronda is the Assistant Dean for Innovation, Clinical Research, and Scholarship at the University of Miami School of Nursing and Health Studies. Her areas of expertise include family caregiver education, simulation and technology, and cultural humility. Throughout her career, Dr. Foronda has worked to implement culturally-tailored, patient-centered interventions for underserved children and families. An expert in evaluating educational interventions, she is focused on encouraging breakthroughs through use of innovation and diverse teaching methods. Dr. Foronda developed the Theory of Cultural Humility as well as an instrument to measure cultural humility. Her work has been cited in the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Simulation (NCSBN) Guidelines for Pre-licensure Nursing Programs, and World Health Organization Simulation in Nursing and Midwifery Education Guide. Dr. Foronda has published over 70 articles in peer-reviewed journals, having several articles listed as high-impact, and serves on the editorial boards for Nurse Educator, Advances in Simulation, and Clinical Simulation in Nursing. Her work in simulation has resulted in several international awards. Dr. Foronda was a 2018 Macy Foundation Faculty Scholar and the 2020 President of the International Nursing Association for Clinical Simulation in Learning.
