

Criteria:

1. A record of outstanding contributions to SP methodology or medical simulation education.

Examples include:

- a. Development of a new and innovative curricula or educational program
- b. Novel approaches to SP methodology
- c. Synthesis of existing educational theory to enhance educator understanding
- d. Advocacy for high quality SP-based education on the national or international level

2. National or international recognition of expertise in SP methodology or medical simulation education

3. Scholarly achievement in the broad field of SP or medical simulation education with dissemination of work beyond their home institution. Examples include:

- a. Peer reviewed publications
- b. Invited editorials
- c. Invited or competitively selected workshops at national or international meetings
- d. Symposia or courses
- e. Web-based publications of educational tools, course, or strategies

4. Evidence of experience of delivering presentations, workshops, seminars. Examples include:

- a. International, national, regional, recognition of their work
- b. A record of invited presentations at national or international meetings or institutions other than their home institution
- c. Testimonials or recommendations from ASPE members, Conference Committee, or ASPE Board
